

CAPE MAY (May 16, 2016) — One of many talented musical acts to perform at this year’s Cape May Music Festival is The Jōst Project on Sunday evening, June 5 - 8 p.m. at the Cape May Convention Hall, 714 Beach Avenue. The band fuses the genres of classic rock and jazz as they reach into the “baby boomer” and subsequent generations that came of age with the music of the Beatles, Aerosmith, Led Zeppelin, Simon & Garfunkel and many others, rarely played by jazz groups. The band members are Vineland, NJ’s Paul Jost-vocals/arrangements, vibraphonist Tony Miceli, bassist Kevin MacConnell with special guests Marko Marcinko-drums and Jonathan Ragonese-saxophone. The Jōst Project, whose music is heard regularly on the Real Jazz channel of SiriusXM Radio, has been performing throughout the world taking their music to South Korea (for two summer tours) and to Ireland. Playing in New York and throughout PA and NJ, they have gotten raves from many reviewers and music industry experts for their CD “Can’t Find My Way Home” (Dot Time Records).
