The band plays innovative arrangements of such songs as “Walk This Way, Kashmir, Maybe I’m Amazed” and many others.

The talented Philly-area jazz artists in the band are Germantown’s Tony Miceli-vibes, Paul Jost-vocals/harmonica, Kevin MacConnell-bass with guest drummer Doug Hirlinger.
